Name 2 things you think Jesus would have eaten when he was a boy.

There's not much written in the Bible about Jesus when he was a little boy so we can't know exactly what he looked like or how he lived, but many people have studied this, and we believe he would have lived like other little boys of his time and place. He may have eaten things like eggs, dates, fish, flat bread and grapes.

Who is Jesus' cousin?

Jesus' cousin is John the Baptist. John was born about 6 months before Jesus and his special job was to prepare people for Jesus to come. He baptised many people, including Jesus.

What is the Bible filled with?

The Bible is filled with good news for everyone. It contains messages of God's love and care that means that everyone in our world will be able to live a better, more whole, more healthy life. It is a guide that can teach us how to live in good relationships with God, with others, with creation and with ourselves.

What does Luke's story of Jesus' birth teach us?

There are two stories in the Bible about Jesus' birth. One in Luke's Gospel and one in Matthew's.

Both stories have big ideas and lessons in them. Some of these are the same and some are different. The story we often share at Christmas time is a combination of both stories. In Luke's story, the first people to hear about Jesus' birth weren't rich or famous, they weren't kings or priests- they were ordinary people, they were shepherds. They were very important people to God, just like we all are. God may have told them the news about Jesus' birth first for a reason, to make it clear that Jesus' love is for everyone. It doesn't matter what you wear or where you live, Jesus' came for you. God's love is for us all to enjoy.
